WEEK 1

Please create a poster showcasing one typeface of your choice. Please use hierarchy, correct kerning, multiple weights, and write a couple paragraphs on the history and tone of the typeface. The poster design should reflect the tone of the typeface.

WEEK 3

Please create a short guide on 'How to pair fonts'. The guide can take whatever format you wish, it can be a short essay, a poster, an infographic, children's picture book, a step by step instruction sheet or whatever else you wish to make!

WEEK 5

Please design the first page of this magazine. Focus on creating a clear hierarchy to guide the reader and paying careful attention to typographic rules. Please use the copy and image below in your design (you can add more copy and images if you wish to)

WEEK 7

Please hand sketch one letter in a regular, thin/light, bold and italic style. For example, choose a lowercase letter 'b'. You can either copy an existing font or design your own.

WEEK 8

Please submit 3 different custom type experiments. We aren't looking for you to have become an expert overnight, so don't worry if they don't feel perfect or fully finished. Please annotate your designs to show your intentions and anything you would rework and suggest what context your designs would be appropriate for.

- Student has paid marginall attention to where kerning was needed
- Has shown different weights of fonts, but not clear or difficult to compare.
- Poor summary of the history and background of the font.
- The general tone of the poster does not sit with the history and spirit of the font.
- Poor use of colour and understanding of how it fits with the font.

F Inadequate

- The final design shows inadequate hierarchy of information
- Student has paid inadequate attention to where kerning was needed
- Has not shown different weights of fonts or font weights are missing.
- Poor summary of the history and background of the font.
- Inadequate consideration to tone of the poster fitting with the history and spirit of the font.
- Inadequate use of colour and understanding of how it fits with the font.

- Excellent layout
- Excellent understanding of what makes good font pairings
- Excellent examples to show this
- Excellent examples that compare and contrast.

- Little consideration to use or choice of colour, fonts and graphic elements. Some or all could be better.
